In an effort to assist local students who are unable to attend classes this semester at colleges located in regions of Texas affected by Hurricane Harvey, McLennan Community College will offer courses comparable to the student's current course schedule and assist in communicating with their college to ensure the courses will transfer upon completion. MCC advisors are available to help plan course schedules on a case-by-case basis.

MCC President Johnette McKown says, "McLennan's college and university colleagues across the state are responding to their students, employees, and constituents in phenomenal ways. President Betty McCrohan from Wharton County Junior College shared that they are doing okay but are uncertain about what will occur when the river crests. She said there is likely to be a significant impact on their enrollment and revenue, and she has never seen such widespread devastation. Sitting here in Waco, I have wanted MCC to help. We are hopeful that our plan might assist some students as they pursue their dreams."
